CALL FOR ABSTRACTS DEADLINE: July 8, 2026

The Florida Brownfields Conference showcases state-of-the-art practices in this industry, with an emphasis on advancing progress of this successful private/public program. The Florida Brownfields Association invites you to submit an abstract on the following topics:

- Lessons learned in Brownfields Redevelopment
- Brownfields success case studies, including achievement of environmental regulatory closure through unique or creative approaches
- Implementation of H.B. 733 (2025), including successful SRCO issuance and/or other aspects of the Bill
- Chapter 62-524, F.A.C. (Delineated Area Rule) rulemaking and implications
- Chapter 62-788, F.A.C. (Voluntary Cleanup Tax Credit Rule) rulemaking and implications
- Funding and Incentives/Tax Credits (subtopics: leveraging funding sources for Brownfield projects)
- Capital Investment in Brownfield Sites: the pros and cons
- Collaborative efforts between lenders, redevelopers, regulators, and community stakeholders
- The next chapter in affected communities and Environmental Justice (subtopics: Community Health Improvements through Brownfields)

Redevelopment, and Education/Workforce Development as an Environmental Justice Catalyst)

- **Emerging contaminants of concern and impact on transactions**
- **Sustainability/Resiliency and Alternate Energy Sources**

When submitting your abstract, please indicate the category that best represents your contribution. Your topic may be proposed as an individual topic (20 mins) or a panel discussion (up to 3 speakers for up to 1 hour). *The Planning Committee will work with approved speakers regarding their proposed topic and duration based on available time slots. The Planning Committee reserves the right to adjust proposed times and presentation topics to accommodate as many speakers and presentations as possible.*

The Planning Committee will accept abstracts through July 8, 2026. Abstracts should meet the following criteria:

- One-page maximum in length, limit to 500-words;
- Point of contact, including contact information (name, company or affiliation, email address, and telephone number);
- Include session title;
- Proposed presentation duration (20 mins for individual presentation and up to 1 hour/three speakers for panel discussions); provide proposed speaker(s) and their relevance to the topic;
- Presentation format (PowerPoint, handouts, and/or other); and
- Provide a thorough overview of the proposed topic, clearly and concisely outline the material proposed, including the content to be presented and projects/case studies to be referenced.

Abstracts with a pronounced commercial or marketing tone will not be accepted.
