6. Building Blocks for Sustainable Communities – Local Foods / Local Places Technical Assistance Completed in Fort Pierce, FL

In 2018, EPA selected Fort Pierce to participate in the Local Foods, Local Places program. This technical assistance program engages local partners to develop community action plans that support neighborhood revitalization

through investments in local food systems. EPA provides a consultant team to guide the process, which included a site tour, a community workshop and development of an action plan.

With the information from the community during the visioning workshop, the team developed a Community Action Plan with five goals and supporting actions and stakeholders for each goal. Other workshop outcomes include:

- A mapping program developed with the University of Florida.
- Funding for a food nutrition position from the Health Department.
- Community Champions for the Garden, Blue Tubes grant from Wells Fargo.
- A new co-chair for the Food Council.

Building on this foundation, EPA selected United Against Poverty and a dynamic group of local community-based and local government partners in 2020 to receive equitable development technical assistance through EPA's Building Blocks for Sustainable Communities program. The program helps facilitate discussions about growth and building capacities for neighborhood revitalization. With support from EPA, Fort Pierce community leaders will host a series of workshops in spring 2021 to identify strategies to advance living-wage jobs, affordable housing and community health in the Lincoln Park neighborhood.
