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## GOVERNOR'S BUDGET

Last week, Governor Ron DeSantis proposed his \$114.8 billion "Framework for Freedom" budget for the coming fiscal year, which includes higher pay for schoolteachers and bonus money to lure retired military and first responders into teaching, as well as pay bumps for law enforcement, corrections officers, and other state employees. The proposal seeks to return some money to taxpayers by making some sales tax exemptions, while continuing to offer another year of many of the one-time politically popular tax holidays residents have gotten used to. The proposal also would create a new tax break on household items under \$25 in a nod to inflation. DeSantis is also asking lawmakers to continue to put money toward the governor's controversial program that sends migrants to other states, boost funding for the governor's election crimes investigation unit, and offer a new sales tax break that encourages people to buy gas stoves.

The governor's proposal would include an across-the-board 5% pay increase for all state employees, with bigger bumps for some. Correctional officers would see their pay rise to \$23 an hour. Other law enforcement officers could be eligible for what DeSantis called "historic pay increases." In addition to providing for a \$200 million increase for teacher salaries, the governor's proposal also would put \$10 million toward a recruitment bonus for retired military veterans and first responders who agree to teach for at least two years. The proposed schools budget would boost spending on school safety initiatives by \$40 million and student transportation spending by \$20 million statewide. The \$14.1 billion allocated to the K-12 system in DeSantis' plan would be the most ever for the state's schools.

The recommendations include \$15.7 billion in reserves and \$1.5 billion in new tax relief, though much of it is in the form of temporary sales tax exemptions that would end after a year. The governor does propose some permanent cuts, however, including an end to sales tax on baby and toddler needs and pet medications. Among the proposed tax breaks is a one-year tax exemption on household items under \$25, billed as a "household rescue year to reduce the impact of inflation on Florida families." And in a political messaging tax cut, DeSantis proposes to make gas stoves tax free, a move to encourage their purchase in Florida in response to discussions by some clean energy advocates in other parts of the country about banning them. DeSantis also is asking lawmakers to spend \$12 million to continue the controversial program that seeks to respond to illegal immigration by paying to send migrants to other states.

The governor's recommendation also would increase spending on water protection. Some of the other environmentally focused spending the Governor proposed includes:

- \$614 million for everglades restoration projects
- \$370 million for targeted water quality improvements to achieve nutrient reductions
- \$50 million for Springs
- \$85 million for Piney Point
- \$65 million to reduce blue-green algae and red tide
- \$50 million for alternative water supply grant program
- \$406 million for resiliency planning and coral reef protection.
- \$25 million for payments and tax refunds for the Brownfield Redevelopment Tax Refund, QTI Tax Refund - Brownfield Redevelopment Bonus, QDSC and other programs.
- \$180 million for Petroleum Tanks Cleanup
- \$9 million for Dry Cleaning Solvent Contaminated Site Cleanup
- \$5.5 million for Hazardous Waste Cleanup

The budget fully funds the Sadowski Affordable Housing Trust Funds with \$402.7 million and provides \$100 million to the Hometown Heroes Housing Program. The proposal also includes \$100 million for the Job Growth Grant Fund and \$100 million for Visit Florida.

Of course, the legislature will ultimately decide what will be included in the 2023-2024 spending plan (subject to the Governor's veto pen), and the Appropriations Subcommittees will give everyone a sneak peek at their priorities when they roll out their proposed budgets around week 3 of Session.

## SPECIAL SESSION "B"

In addition to regularly scheduled committee meetings, this week also included the first Special Session of 2023 (there was another Special Session called back in December to address property insurance issues). The legislature took up and passed several pieces of legislation related to the issues included in the call:

- *Emergency Management* – HB 1B & SB 2B (Giallombardo/Albritton) – provides emergency relief for local governments impacted by hurricanes Ian and Nicole by creating the Local Government Emergency Bridge Loan Program and provides \$50m in nonrecurring funds for the program. The bill also transfers \$650 million to the Emergency Preparedness and Response Fund to be used for responding to a declared state of emergency.
- *Statewide Prosecutor* – HB 2B & SB 4B (Fernandez-Barquin/Martin) - clarifies the Office of Statewide Prosecution jurisdiction to prosecute crimes involving elections for a federal or state office, and petition activities.
- *Illegal Immigration* – HB 5B & SB 6B (Snyder/Ingoglia) - creates the Unauthorized Alien Transport Program to facilitate the transport of unauthorized aliens, and provides \$10m for the program.
- *Name, Image, Likeness* – HB 7B & SB 8B (LaMarca/Hutson) – modifies provisions relating to intercollegiate athlete compensation and rights. Protects postsecondary institutions and their staff from liability related to loss of an athlete's ability to NIL compensation due to routine decisions taken in the course of intercollegiate athletics.
- *Reedy Creek* – HB 9 (Hawkins) - ratifies and confirms the continued existence of the Reedy Creek Improvement District under a new name, the Central Florida Tourism Oversight District, and provides legislative intent regarding the district's authority to raise revenue and pay outstanding bonds and obligations without interruption. The bill retains the district's necessary authority related to taxation and the issuance of bonds, and allows the Governor to appoint all of the 5 member board.
- *The Sunshine Water Control District and Eastpoint Water and Sewer District (HB 11B by Daley & HB 13B by Shoaf, respectively)* - Reenacts, amends, & repeals special act relating to district to provide for the continuation of their authority, which was inadvertently impacted when the legislature passed the bill dissolving Reedy Creek last Session.

## FBA LEGISLATIVE DAY

The Florida Brownfields Association hosted several of its members in Tallahassee this week to conduct the Strategic Planning Meeting and for their 2023 Legislative Day. On Monday, FBA members heard presentations from the US EPA, the Environmental Justice and Public Health Committee, the Education & Membership Committee, the Legislative, Policy & Technical Committee, and heard from Billy Hessman and

Scott Sweeney from the Florida Department of Environmental Protection to serve on a panel to discuss VCTC, PFAS, and other issues of importance to the Association.

On Tuesday, the FBA team gathered to conduct legislative meetings at the Capitol to raise awareness of the association and let the legislature know that our top priority for 2023 is securing additional funding for VCTC in the annual tax package. Despite the fact that several legislators were bogged down with both committees and Special Session activities, the GrayRobinson team was able to secure several meetings with key decision makers. The day's robust agenda included meetings with multiple House members and staff:
